A MESSAGE FROM OUR HEAD TEACHER

It has been Parliament week this week, and schools around the country have been looking at what Parliament is, and how it runs. On Monday Mr Dore led a special assembly to share with children the role of our MPs and to look at how rules and laws are made. Then, yesterday, Mr Dore and I met with the Parliament representatives for MPA and we discussed ideas for things we can do to make our school even better. There were lots of good ideas; Jackson and Brian mentioned how sometimes behaviour in the toilets was not what we would expect so we created toilet monitor roles. All representatives agreed that behaviour could be better at MPA so we agreed that we would launch a new 'recognition' system so reward pupils for behaving well even when they think no one is watching!

Parliament reps and adults in the school will have five special raffle tickets to give out each day – pupils can 'save or spend' the tickets each Friday in the special prize shop. This will be launched over the next couple of weeks – I wonder who will win the first ever ticket!?

Willows have had another busy week. We have continued to explore the story of 'The Three Little Pigs', including finding out about real pigs!

The children have made bird feeders from clay, which will be filled with bird seed and hung from the trees in the forest school area. In Maths, the children have been exploring 4-sided shapes and learning how to sort them from other 2-D shapes.

The children have also started to learn the songs for the upcoming nativity play and will soon be told which part they will play.

We have been looking at homes this week and thinking about different types of homes. We had a go at drawing our home and comparing a room in our modern home to a room in a much older home.

We also had lots of fun making our clay pinch pots on Monday. We used air drying clay, and we will be painting them soon!

We have been working hard in Math's to practice our number bonds and in English to use our phonics knowledge to write sentences. We then used this knowledge to practice typing sentences in Computing!










Sycamore

Hawthorn

This week, in English, we have continued to focus on the Windrush and have completed diary entries from the perspective of a child coming over to England at the end of World War Two. The children have worked really hard on these.

In maths, we've been looking at fractions, changing improper fractions into mixed number fractions, and then adding and subtracting these.

In science, we have made parachutes and tested their aerodynamic, which all of the children enjoyed.

In design and technology, we have been constructing bridges with arches and testing them out to see how much they can hold.

Next week, we're looking forward to our year 5 trip to the aquarium!

Beech

In English, we are at the end of our topic on the Windrush and the children have nearly finished their diary entries! This week, we will be editing our work to 'publish' in our books. Next week, we will be writing about the Amazon rainforest. A piece of reading comprehension homework will be on its way home to support this.

In science, we are continuing our learning about forces. This week, we focused on air resistance! The children showed their understanding of this opposing force by dropping parachutes with different surface areas from the same height. We then wrote conclusions and showed our results with a line graph.

Free KS2 learning and 11+ preparation

We work in partnership with <u>Atom Learning</u>, the leading online Key Stage 2 learning and 11+ preparation platform, to provide Years 3 - 6 students who are eligible for Pupil Premium with free Atom Home accounts. Atom Home is normally £575.90 per year.

Atom Home allows children to access KS2 learning resources, they'll also be able to get familiar with the type of questions they may see on the 11+, and build exam technique and confidence.
